## UPDATED BINGO INFO FROM SHOREHAVEN

#### MONITOR/RED TAG; CHAIR CHECK & ORANGE LEAF REMINDERS:

At Shorehaven you will see some residents with an orange leaf on their chair or walker. This means the resident is at risk of falling. They may also have a chair check on their chait that will beep if they try to stand or lean too far.

Also, some residents are assigned a plastic "watch like" device. This is a special monitor to let staff know if the resident is leaving the building unattended. You will recognize these residents because their name, household and room number will be on a red card on the back of their wheel chair. A few of these residents are ambulatory, so they will have the watch like device on a wrist or ankle. This resident is at risk of getting lost so you will need to use the code 1938# in order to escort them on and off the elevator.

Please be aware of the following rules when you are escorting residents at Shorehaven:

- ALWAYS let household staff know when you are taking residents out of their households and when you bring them back.
- ALWAYS take a resident with an orange leaf or red tag back to the common area of their household (dining room/IV area) and NOT to their room. If a resident is returned to their room and staff does not know they are back they are at risk of falling.
- If the alarm goes off when you are trying to take a resident with a red tag to an
  activity, please ask a staff person to assist you as you can no longer use a code to
  stop the alarm.
- NEVER LEAVE THIS RESIDENT alone at an activity, always take them back to their household first when the activity if over.
- NEVER take or assist a resident to the bathroom. Call their household or take them back to the commons area of their household and let staff know they are back.

The reason residents have orange leaves is because they are at risk of falling.

The reason residents have red tags is because they are at risk of getting lost, so please be aware when you are escorting these residents.

#### TO ALL BINGO SERVICE GROUPS:

Thank-you again for your participation in the Monday night bingo activities for our residents at Shorehaven in 2016, it was appreciated.

BUT...it is very important that you share the following information every month with the members of your group that will be working the bingo.

\*IT IS CRITICAL THAT YOU DO <u>NOT</u>SERVE RESIDENTS WITH a YELLOW SWALLOWING GUIDELINE FOOD or DRINK. If you have questions regarding which resident should be served, ask the lead volunteer Norma Tunak or a staff person to help you.

I am again sending the bingo guidelines for the red tag/orange leaf program as a reminder for your volunteers. I am also including the 2017 schedule for you to mark your calendars.

We ask that if you bring candy bars as prizes, make sure they are **FUN SIZE** candy bars without nuts. It is also a good idea to bring bananas or non-food items for prizes so they have a variety.

PLEASE make an effort to arrive in the Great Room by <u>5:45pm</u> to help set up and escort residents to the Great Room for a 6:30pm start and remain until bingo is over and everything is put away. We would also like you to clean up your mess after the treat is served, especially if you bring cake.
