## **BOSTON STORE FUNDRAISER**

Once again we will be selling Boston Store books for their fall community days. This year the sale dates will again be for 4 days – November 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>. The coupons can be used ahead of the sale dates starting about November 1 through November 8 and then pick up the merchandise from November 8<sup>th</sup> to the 19<sup>th</sup>. If they can't make it to the store there is a 30% online coupon. I will be passing out the books soon. Look over the book, there are some very good bargains, especially with using the \$10 coupon. Encourage people to buy the books and stock up

on some items they will need in the future. Also, buy items to donate to next year's silent auction. As usual our Club gets to keep \$5.00 for every sale. Last year we cleared \$1210.24 (Bonus check included) and this year our goal is at least \$1000. Our goal is for the members to sell/buy at least 4 books. They make great gifts or a thank you to someone. Emphasize that their \$5.00 donation gets them a book that can save them over \$500 or more and if nothing else by using the \$10.00 coupon they double their money. **Money we make goes towards all the good things we do and support.** Please turn in your sales count & money ASAP as I need to give them a weekly count on sales. We need 100 sold to get selected to sell on the sale dates and share in the bonus check from books sold by Boston Store Sales Associates.

We will also be doing pre-sales at the Mayfair store four times which has been successful in the past. The dates are October 5<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>. All Thursdays from noon to 2:00PM. We have 2 doors to cover so it would be great to get 4 signed up each time, 2 at each door. I will have a sign up sheet. In the past we have car pooled or you can meet us at the store. Sign up and test your sale skills. All they can do is say no. It can be fun trying to turn a no into a yes.
